International Baccalaureate Surcharge

If a student elects to study the International Baccalaureate, the following additional Tuition Fee will apply in 2021.
Year 11: 2 instalments of \$780 charged with each instalment totalling \$1,560 per annum.
Year 12: 2 instalments of \$1,170 charged with each instalment totalling \$2,340 per annum.

Sibling Rebate

Allowance applied for younger brothers and sisters attending the School concurrently:

General

1. The fees detailed above are effective from 1 January 2021 and will remain in force until such time as changed by the School Board.
2. Whilst it is the aim of the School Board to set fees on an annual basis, the Board reserves the right to change this at any time.
3. School fees fall due at the beginning of the period they cover and are payable in advance.
4. The Fees include Student Accident Insurance Cover, Outdoor Education Camps, co-curricular activities, the School year book - Unitas, excursions, class/tutorial photographs and other relevant items.

Other Non-tuition Fees

- Uniform – Approximately \$1,400 depending on co-curricular activities.
- Books – Approximately \$600 per year depending on subject choices.
- Laptop computer – Approximately \$1,500 for students in Years 7 to 12
- Homestay – Term time long weekends and School Holidays \$58 per day for school arranged homestay. Externally arranged, approved homestay provider at their applicable rates. Current provider charges comprise matching fee \$290, \$78 per night or \$340 per week plus transport fee of \$140, if applicable.

Overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC)

Medical Insurance is a requirement for students studying on a Student Visa and will be on charged prior to commencement of studies. Students can view OSHC providers and policies (see www.studyinaustralia.gov.au/global/live-in-australia/insurance) which will be arranged by the School. Students are required to pre-pay OSHC for the duration of their studies.

Pembroke Building Fund

Pembroke has a forward looking Strategic Plan 2018-2024 that is underwritten by a detailed Facilities Master Plan. Underpinned by the School Aims and through its Strategic Plan, the School is maintaining its momentum to think ahead whilst recognising our strengths and reinforcing our values. The School Board will share details of the next major building projects as soon as they have been decided. We have shown what is possible with the new and exciting Shipsters Road Building and we will strive to complete more high calibre projects as we are able.

However, to realise the Strategic Plan the School will be heavily reliant on philanthropic support by the wider school community to make some of these dreams, realities. In this context, your support of the School Building Fund is both encouraged and greatly appreciated. We invite you to be a part of realising the School's Strategic Plan by making a donation to the Pembroke Building Fund. The suggested amount is \$810 per annum of \$405 per instalment. Your valued donation will be recognised under the School's Community Giving Programme with cumulative donations of \$1,000 qualifying the donor(s) for membership to the Pembroke School Foundation.

School Policies and Your Obligations

School Policies on enrolments and fees are outlined below:

1. The persons who have contractually taken on responsibility agree to be bound by the School's fees and charges.
2. The Schools accounts for fees, charges and disbursements are to be paid within four weeks of the account being first rendered. The School reserves the right to refuse continued enrolment at the School if the account is not paid by the due date. The account must be up to date before a student is permitted to go on any non-curriculum trips, camps or excursions for which a charge is levied.
3. Annual Tuition and Boarding fees are payable in two equal instalments. Newly enrolled students cannot make payment of more than one semester's fees, in the first instance. Students who have completed at least one semester of study at Pembroke prior to January 2021 are eligible to pay the total 2021 Tuition Fee in full, prior to 12 February 2021, in which case a discount of 2.0% on Tuition fees will be applied.
4. The School reserves the right to recover any collection costs as a result of accounts being overdue.
5. The School requires a full term's notice in writing to be given before the removal of a student from the Day School and before the discontinuation of any special extra subject. Failing such notice the applicable fee for a full term will be levied.
6. Enrolment and re-enrolment into the Boarding House is for the full school year unless otherwise agreed. Parents accept the responsibility for the payment of the boarding fees for the whole of each year or the agreed lesser period for which the student is accepted into the Boarding House. No refund will be offered for students whose accommodation ends "early" due to the nature of their study, for example Year 12 students who in most cases leave the Boarding House prior to the end of Term 4, on the completion of their final examinations/assessments. Students not re-enrolling into the Boarding House for the following year must give notice no later than the first day of Term 4 of the preceding year. Failing such notice annual boarding fees for the subsequent year will be levied.
7. Written application for rebates for extended absences due to student illness must be made to the Principal, Mr L Thomson.
