The Indulkaninna Foundation Scholarship for Boarding

1. Scholarship Overview

The Indulkaninna Foundation Scholarship for Boarding has been established by a generous Pembroke old scholar family in support of boarding students.

The Scholarship recognises students who demonstrate strong academic potential, personal character and a commitment to contributing positively to the life of the School. It was established to increase access to a Pembroke Boarding education for students from regional and rural Australia who would otherwise be unable to do so without financial assistance.

2. Eligibility

Applicants must:

- Be an Australian citizen or permanent resident of Australia
- Be seeking entry between Years 7 and 12 at Pembroke School
- Be a new or current Pembroke student
- Become a boarder at Pembroke School upon commencement

Preference may be given to students whose principal residence lies in rural Australia and preferably outside of regional towns and cities. Applications from School of the Air students will be given favourable consideration.

3. Selection Criteria

In assessing applications, consideration will be given to the applicant's:

- Demonstrated commitment to learning and consistent academic progress
- Personal qualities including integrity, resilience, responsibility and alignment with the values of Pembroke School
- Contribution to school and community life through leadership, service and co-curricular involvement
- Willingness to contribute positively to the academic, co-curricular and boarding life of Pembroke School
- Overall alignment with the purpose of the Scholarship

4. Considerations

The Indulkaninna Foundation Scholarship for Boarding was established to increase access to a Pembroke education for students who demonstrate the qualities sought by the School but who would otherwise be unable to enrol due to financial circumstances, adverse personal circumstances or other educational disadvantage including geographical distance.



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In addition to the selection criteria outlined above, consideration will be given to applicants who can demonstrate that financial assistance is essential to accepting and maintaining a place at Pembroke School.

Where applicable, applicants may be asked to provide information to assist the School in assessing eligibility for this Scholarship.

5. Scholarship Value

The Scholarship provides a remission of the sum equal to the value of one year's boarding fees per annum for the duration of the recipient's schooling at Pembroke, subject to the Conditions of the Scholarship.

Scholarships are awarded at the Principal's discretion. The value and duration of each Scholarship may vary according to the individual circumstances of the recipient and the purpose of the Scholarship.

6. Conditions of the Scholarship

To retain the Scholarship, recipients must:

- Maintain a strong academic standard and engagement in their studies
- Uphold the values and expectations of Pembroke School
- Contribute positively to the academic, co-curricular and boarding life of the School
- Remain enrolled as a boarder at Pembroke School
- Maintain satisfactory attendance
- Comply with the School's policies and expectations
- Continue to meet any Scholarship-specific requirements

Scholarships are reviewed annually. Continuation is subject to the recipient continuing to meet these conditions and remains at the Principal's discretion.

7. Assessment Process

Applications are submitted through the Pembroke School online Scholarship Application Form.

Shortlisted applicants will be invited to an interview with the Principal or a nominated member of the School's Leadership Team.

Applicants will be advised of the outcome following completion of the selection process.
