Isolated Students' Scholarships and Bursaries

1. Scholarship Overview

Pembroke School is committed to increasing access to a high quality independent education for students from geographically isolated communities.

The Isolated Students' Scholarships and Bursaries support students for whom boarding is necessary to access secondary education, recognising applicants who demonstrate strong academic potential, personal character and a commitment to contributing positively to the life of the School.

2. Eligibility

Applicants must:

- Be seeking entry into Years 7 to 11 at Pembroke School
- Be eligible to receive the Australian Government Assistance for Isolated Children (AIC) Boarding Allowance
- Become a boarder at Pembroke School upon commencement
- Not be in receipt of another Pembroke School Scholarship or Bursary

Preference may be given to students currently enrolled in a School of the Air program or whose principal residence is in a geographically isolated area.

3. Selection Criteria

In assessing applications, consideration will be given to the applicant's:

- Demonstrated commitment to learning and consistent academic progress
- Personal qualities including integrity, resilience, responsibility and alignment with the values of Pembroke School
- Contribution to school and community life through leadership, service and co-curricular involvement
- Willingness to contribute positively to the academic, co-curricular and boarding life of Pembroke School
- Overall alignment with the purpose of the Scholarship

4. Considerations

These Scholarships and Bursaries were established to increase pathways to a Pembroke education for students from geographically isolated communities where boarding is necessary to access secondary education.



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In addition to the selection criteria outlined above, consideration will be given to applicants who:

- Are eligible to receive the Australian Government Assistance for Isolated Children (AIC) Boarding Allowance
- Can demonstrate that financial assistance is essential to accepting and maintaining a place at Pembroke School

Where applicable, applicants may be asked to provide information to assist the School in assessing eligibility for the Scholarship or Bursary.

5. Scholarship Value

These Scholarships provide up to **50% remission** of tuition fees.

These Bursaries provide up to **25% remission** of tuition fees.

Scholarships and Bursaries are awarded at the Principal's discretion. The value and duration of each award may vary according to the individual circumstances of the recipient and the purpose of the Scholarship or Bursary.

6. Conditions of the Scholarship

To retain the Scholarship or Bursary, recipients must:

- Maintain a strong academic standard and engagement in their studies
- Uphold the values and expectations of Pembroke School
- Contribute positively to the academic, co-curricular and boarding life of the School
- Remain enrolled as a boarder at Pembroke School
- Maintain eligibility for the Australian Government Assistance for Isolated Children (AIC) Boarding Allowance
- Maintain satisfactory attendance
- Comply with the School's policies and expectations
- Continue to meet any Scholarship or Bursary-specific requirements

Scholarships and Bursaries are reviewed annually. Continuation is subject to the recipient continuing to meet these conditions and remains at the Principal's discretion.

7. Assessment Process

Applications are submitted through the Pembroke School online Scholarship application form.

Shortlisted applicants will be invited to an interview with the Principal or a nominated member of the School's Leadership Team.

Applicants will be advised of the outcome following completion of the selection process.
